Scholarships for Master's studies abroad

Duration Depending on the study programme, one to 2 academic years (maximum 24 months)

Value Monthly scholarship depending on your host country, travel subsidy, insurance, language course,

family allowance, subsidy for tuition fees

Deadline Depends on country of application

HAW.International: Semester stays and thesis

In Brief Study visits and stays abroad within the framework of a final thesis

Who Students (BA/MA) of all disciplines at HAW/FH

Duration Minimum 1 month (thesis)/3 months (study visit) to maximum 6 months

Value Monthly scholarship depending on your host country, travel subsidy, insurance, language course,

subsidy for tuition fees (study visit), subsidy for travel in the host country that is directly related to the

project (thesis), family allowances

Duration Minimum 2 months to maximum of 6 months

family allowances

Deadline Usually end of February, July and October

Duration Minimum 4 months to maximum of 6 months for self organized internships or 8 months for advertised

Deadline Probably spring 2025

Research scholarships for doctoral students

Who Doctoral candidates at a German institution

Duration Minimum 1 month to maximum 12 months per grant (twice during your PhD, up to 18 months in total)

Value Monthly scholarship depending on your host country, travel subsidy, insurance, language course,

family allowance, subsidy for tuition fees, monthly lump sum for research and congress costs

Deadline Depends on country of application

Congress Participation / HAW.International: Congress and trade fair trips

In Brief Funding for "active participation" in International Conferences (presentation of poster, talk or panel)

Who for Predocs, postdocs, faculty & retired, Germans and foreigners at German universities and

universities of the applied sciences (HAW)

Value Flat Rate (travel, fees, daily subsidy) or fees (virtual participation)

Deadline 120 days before 1st conference day

Starting in 2024, the programme will focus more on sustainability with 4 funding categories depending on the travelled distance and there will be a subsidies for environmentally friedly travel/carbon compensation.

Duration 9 months for Master students;

36 months for PhD students;

6 to 24 months for postdoctoral researchers;

1 to 3 months for senior scientists

Value Master students: 934 €/month plus additional payments;

PhD Students: 1,760 €/month plus additional payments;

Postdocs: 2,400 €/month;

senior scientists: 2,760 €/month

Aim of the programme

- Support and accompany the Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA) adopted in 2022 from the "European Green Hydrogen Agenda Process", a pilot initiative of the European Research Area (ERA)
- Qualification of future specialists and young scientists
- Strengthen and establish international cooperation and networks, especially in the ERA
- Enhance interdisciplinarity and innovative capacity, provide substantive research contributions

Programme components

- Mobility support: individual fellowships for research stays and internships (for Master, PhD and PostDocs)
- Professional support and networking measures: Establishment of four working groups & research tour



Mobility support

- Mobility component includes stays abroad of varying length for research, studies and internships
- For the following university training and career stages: Master students, PhD students and Postdocs
- Applicants from various scientific disciplines (natural and engineering sciences, economics and social sciences, logistics and law) whose study or research focus is clearly related to the topic of "green hydrogen" and can be assigned to one of the four working groups (production, transport/infrastructure, market stimulation, cross-cutting issues) are eligible to apply
- Additional funding for further training, conference travel
- Climate-friendly mobility: CO₂ compensation, Green Mobility Top Up



Outgoing mobility: starting from Germany

No restrictions

Incoming mobility: from selected countries of origin to Germany

- European Research Area: EU members
- Africa: Côte d'Ivoire, Cameroon, Ghana, Morocco, Namibia, Nigeria, Senegal, South Africa, Tunisia, Togo
- North & South America: Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, USA
- Asia: Japan, South Korea, Taiwan
- Europe: Albania, Armenia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Faroe Islands, Georgia, Iceland, Israel, Kosovo, Moldova,
 Montenegro, North Macedonia, Norway, Serbia, Switzerland, Türkiye, Ukraine, United Kingdom
- Oceania: Australia, New Zealand



Working Groups - Professional support and networking measures

The working groups aim to create a **forum for active knowledge exchange and networking** between ERA green hydrogen fellows, experts and representatives from industry, academia and governmental organizations.

Four working groups are in progress according to the agenda process (SRIA):

- 1. Production
- 2. Transport and Infrastructure
- **3. Market stimulation:** securing the market for green hydrogen will stimulate demand, stabilize cost and production, and make green hydrogen a competitive tradable in the economy.
- **4. Cross-cutting issues:** socio-economic and environmental issues, regulatory and legislative framework, development of standards for the creation of a common and integrated system at the EU level, questions for civil society, ethical issues, among others.



DAAD's Information Tour "Green Hydrogen Research and Technology in Germany" is designed to bring together German and international researchers from the extended European Research Area, with the objective to facilitate the exchange of ideas, to initiate collaboration and joint projects.

PhD students and postdocs from the extended European Research Area (ERA) can meet with colleagues at renowned German research institutions to gain first-hand information and insights into promising research results and technological developments.

Checklist for the application

- Does the offer meet your personal and professional needs?
- Do you meet the formal requirements of the scholarship programme from academic status to subject area?
- Are the content-related requirements correct: e.g. academic achievements, degree?
- Do you have all the necessary application documents together by the application deadline?
- Are you prepared for the main points of an interview and do you know what you want to achieve within the framework of the scholarship?



Selection criteria

- Academic qualification
 - Academic achievements
 - Course of studies
 - Knowledge of the language(s) of instruction or working language(s)
 - If applicable, relevant internships, work experience
- Quality of the study project
 - Quality of the study project and of the preparation (preliminary information, choice of degree programme, host university and establishment of contacts)

- Integration of the project into the academic career path
- Potential of the applicant
 - Motivation: academic and personal reasons for the stay in Germany/abroad
 - Prospects: Significance of the stay in Germany/abroad for further academic, professional and personal development.
 - Extracurricular commitment: extracurricular knowledge and skills, social commitment.



The application - What else needs to be considered?

- Good preparation for an application for a DAAD scholarship needs time.
- Read the programme announcement thoroughly.
- Application times vary according to region/country.
- Applications often require a number of documents, Language certificates, letter of recommendation of a university teacher.
- Therefore: Do not apply at the last minute!
